Frequently asked questions

I cannot find my National Insurance Number. What do I do?

Call the National Insurance Enquires helpline on 0300 200 3500. Lines are open Mon-Fri, 8am-5pm.

Will the Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) affect my benefits?

No, claiming the EYPP will not affect any benefits you may be entitled to.

Will my nursery, pre-school or childminder get to know my personal details and what happens to the information I have provided?

No, on checking for eligibility your nursery, pre-school or childminder will not be given any of your personal details. Any information you give will be processed according to the Data Protection Policy of the nursery, pre-school or childminder.

Can the EYPP be used to cover any extra costs I am paying for at the nursery?

No, the money will go to your nursery to support your child's learning and development, it cannot be used to reduce any costs you already pay.

Can the EYPP be used for extra sessions at nursery?

The nursery is free to decide with you how best to spend the money, but it cannot simply be used for extra sessions. Talk to your nursery about the different ways it can be used.

Will other parents know my child gets the EYPP?

Any information provided by you will remain confidential and all nurseries, pre-schools and childminders have a Confidentiality Policy.

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Information for parents

Your childcare provider could receive extra government money to help your three or four year old child's learning and development.



It's quick and easy to find out if you can claim for your child

What is the Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP)?

EYPP is extra Government money to boost your three or four year old's early learning. The nursery, pre-school or childminder that you use could get up to £300 a year to help your child's learning.

Your nursery, pre-school or childminder will work with you to decide how best to spend the money to ensure your child really benefits.

Your child could benefit from

- Exciting new learning activities
- Extra equipment to help with learning
- Toys, books and equipment to use at home to help them learn
- One to one or small group sessions
- Opportunities to widen their life experiences

When Ofsted inspect your nursery, pre-school or childminder they will check to see that the additional money is helping your child to learn and develop.

- ✓ Helping your child to be ready for school
- ✓ Helping your child to develop the language skills that will give them a good start
- ✓ Helping your child to develop self-confidence and social skills

- ✓ Helping your child to keep healthy and physically active
- ✓ Support for you to help your child's learning at home

Who could benefit from this money?

Any three or four year old receiving the Free Early Education Entitlement (FEEE) in a nursery, pre-school or at a childminders:

- Whose parents claim certain benefits
- Who has left care through special guardianship, adoption or residence order (If this applies to you talk to your childcare provider, you do not need to complete the form)
